Discussion Questions:

- Jesus was simply "passing through" Jericho on the way to Jerusalem, where he would begin the week leading up to his crucifixion. Jericho was one of the busiest and most powerful cities at the time, and Jesus' most important work lay ahead of him in Jerusalem. But then he delays his plans to stay at Zaccheaus' house. What are the reasons why Jesus might have simply continued with his original plan, rather than stopping to spend time with Zaccheaus?
- Use your five senses to imagine yourself in Jesus' sandals as he enters Zaccheaus' home. What do you see? What do you hear? What might you taste? How does it make you feel?
- What do you think Jesus did while he was present In Zaccheaus' home? What do you think he learned from spending time there?
- What keeps us from being present in our own neighborhoods and communities?
- Do you think relationships develop slower or faster today, compared to in the past? Why? What does that mean for the gospel witness practice of being present?
- READ Luke 19:1-10 again. Slowly. Reflectively. Believe that this is God's word to you today.
 - What words or phrases capture your imagination? What might God be saying to you through them?
- What assumptions did people make about Zacchaeus?
- What assumptions have you made about your neighbors and your neighborhood?
- What do you think God might see when God sees your neighbors and your neighborhood?
