Ice Breaker – What have you experienced when visiting a worship service that has made you feel especially welcome or especially unwelcome?

READ 1 Corinthians 11:17-34

- 1. What was the problem Paul was addressing in 1 Corinthians 11?
- 2. What does Paul mean in verse 29 by "discerning the body of Christ?" What is Paul warning against?
- 3. What might Paul write if he were writing a similar letter of encouragement and instruction to our congregation today?

REVIEW 1 Corinthians 14:1-25

- 4. Considering this part of Paul's letter to the Corinthians, describe what it would have been like to go to church in Corinth?
 - a. Describe what appears to be the intent of those in Corinth who were speaking in tongues and how that affected worship, as well as the unity of the Body.
 - b. Describe prophecy in Corinth.
- 5. Speaking in tongues became in Corinth a measure of spirituality. The more someone spoke in tongues the better a Christian they were considered to be. However, this unintelligible speaking in tongues made no sense to a newcomer. What in our worship might be something that we would consider a sign of faithfulness, but which might be unintelligible to the newcomer?
- 6. What is so important about worshipping together rather than just worshipping as individuals gathered in the same room?
- 7. What affect does failing to bear God's image as he required have on worship? The body of believers gathered in worship? New believers? Nonbelievers?
- 8. If Corinth was divided by social class or the practice of tongues, what things divide us?
 - c. How do we overcome these matters?
 - d. How did you complete the three-minute assignment after worship? Is this something that you are willing to regularly practice?
- 9. How do we move our bridge-making beyond the fellowship hall?
